Lesson Big Ideas

- The starting place for developing a method of counseling or helping others is not the consideration of specific techniques, but rather, a focus upon the nature of God and the nature of man.
- Counseling can be ineffective unless the counselor has a clear understanding of what he/she is looking for in the sessions, and what he/she is seeking to accomplish.
- The counselor's main goal of counseling is to teach the process of problem-solving and individuals being responsible for completing their work.

Essential Questions

- What makes counseling ineffective?
- What is the first thing a counselor looks for in the counseling session?
- What happens if the counselor experiences despair and hopelessness, and at the same time tries to work with those in a similar situation?

Learning Outcomes

- To develop a procedure for evaluating the counselee and one's perception of the problem during the initial interview
- To identify and express the goals and objectives of counseling
- To identify and explain biblical teaching concerning problems and conflicts

Early Stages of Counseling

Goals and Aims of the Early Stages of Counseling for the Counselor

Some of the goals and aims of the initial stages of counseling include:

- 1. To understand the person's current situation
- 2. To help the person to do what is in one's best interest
- 3. To help reduce emotional distress
- 4. To understand how the person has tried to handle the problem
- 5. To understand the person's view of the problem
- 6. To understand the reasons and motivations for seeking counseling
- 7. To understand the individual's emotional reactions
- 8. To estimate tentatively person's strengths
- 9. To evaluate the total problem
- 10. To help them clarify the person life situation and problem
- 11. To resolve conflicts
- 12. To release some of the individual's inner strengths
- 13. To accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior

Tips on reading and comprehending Scripture: To obtain the full benefit of scripture, you have to do more than read. You need to read, study, meditate, and pray on scripture. When you combine these four steps, your understanding will broaden and comprehension will deepen. Hence, God will bless you with fuller revelation into His Word. This in turn will bring you closer to God and will mature you in your walk in Christ.

These are the steps:

- 1. Pray and meditate on each verse. Let it sink into your heart and spirit.
- 2. Ask God for assistance in understanding. He will give you revelation.
- 3. Do a read through once, reread for meaning, and then once again for detail.
- 4. Highlight key words.

Scripture Reflection

Each Bible verse will focus on God's omnipotence, omniscience, and what He says about bringing hope and healing to hurting people. You will have to do three things with each verse. First, read the verse. Second, summarize the verse. Third, write about how you think the verse directly applies to the course's content.
