Lesson Big Ideas

- God revealed a new covenant with Israel to take place in the future (Jer 31:31-34). Not only did this covenant affect Israel, but also the Gentile believers who had been in grafted (Rom 11:17). This covenant remains crucial to redemptive history.
- The Old Testament contains much prophecy; some already have come to pass, while others have yet to come.
- Old Testament prophecy communicates, that in the end, God will be victorious.

Essential Questions

- What is the New Covenant’s important to Jews and Gentiles?
- How does studying prophecy (especially the material in this lesson) show God as all knowing and in control?
