James Background Doer of the Word Session 1

Author

- Most likely James, the Lord's half-brother
- Leader of the Jerusalem church
- Made a significant impact on the early church in Jerusalem (Acts 15; 21).
- Held an authoritative position in the church at the Jerusalem council (Acts 15:13ff)
- Spoke with Paul on his return to Jerusalem at the end of his third missionary journey

Audience

- Twelve tribes who are dispersed abroad (1:1), but not in one location.
- Believers fled during the persecution which came upon Stephen's death
- Jewish Christians dispersed across Judea and Samaria (Acts 8:1), Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Syrian Antioch (Acts 11:19)
- James would have felt responsible as their former pastor to offer

instruction to them at this time

Purpose

- James gave instructions to keep the body of Christ connected
- Theme is Christian faith and bearing works worthy of a genuine Christian
- Admonished readers to practice their faith as doers of the Word
- Emphasized proper response to suffering and trials
- Theme reflects real faith produces genuine stability, humility, love, and patience

Genre

- Epistle
- Probably written before the Council in Jerusalem in AD 49-50
- Letter immerses the reader into the culture of that time
