


The Book of Acts, 2021 Pastor Francek Strlek Session 2: New Birth





Key Scripture (Acts 1:8 NKJV)

"But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be [a]witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Instructional Overview

Big Ideas

- Acts 1:8 provides the journey of ministry campaign from Jerusalem to Judea.
- Persecution resulted in church scattered to Samaria.
- Holy Ghost revival produces church growth.
- This church growth requires believers to address needs of the current needs of the body of Christ.
- The growth experienced in Acts removed barriers and opened the door to salvation to the Samaritans.

Essential Questions

- What impact does revival have on the church?
- How should a Christian respond to modern day persecution?
- Showing kindness to those formerly hated produces what outcome?

- Make sure you include a thesis statement and key points in your opening paragraph, and then break out each key point into subsequent paragraphs.
 - A thesis statement articulates the subject (or claim) of your essay; and concisely summarizes the position you will take.
 - The body of your essay will support your thesis statement and persuade the reader you interpreted the information correctly and presented a valid position
- Add a closing paragraph that sums up your thesis statement.
