"Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ By a new and living way, which he hath consecrated for us, through the veil, that is to say, his flesh; ²¹ And having an high priest over the house of God; ²² Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;) ²⁴ And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: ²⁵ Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching" (Heb 10:19-25 KJV).

Homework Explanation: Organized Writing

Paragraph 1: Introduction

Grabber: A statement that draws the reader into your essay

Definition: Explain what you will write about to the reader

Thesis: Write a sentence that gives the reader your topic and main points in response to the assigned

homework question. (Thesis includes a focus, precise opinion, and two to three main points.)

Paragraph 2: First Main Point

- Topic Sentence: State the first main point from your thesis
- Support and Elaboration: Explain this point with details, support, and short scripture quotes
- Concluding Sentence: Write a summary sentence that wraps up the first point and transitions to the next point

Paragraph 3: Second Main Point

- Transition/Topic Sentence: State the second main point from your thesis connecting it to the previous point
- Support and Elaboration: Explain this point with details, support, and a short scripture quote
- Concluding Sentence: Write a summary sentence that wraps up the second point and transitions to the third point

Paragraph 4: Conclusion

- Reinforce Thesis: Restate your thesis in different words to support your essay's main idea.
- Connection/Concluding Sentence: Leave the reader with a final thought about the topic you want them to remember
- Remember: Your concluding paragraph shows more than a "the end" statement.
