Key Scriptures

Instructional Overview

Big Ideas

- God, the perfect peacemaker, wants His people to be instruments of peace and reconciliation to represent the character of Christ.

Essential Questions

- In a world of conflict, how do you actively pursue peace?
- Which conflict resolution styles support resolving conflict biblically?

Learning Outcomes

- Connects peacemaking attributes with resolving conflict in the analysis of scenarios
- Identifies and explains the three dimensions of peace related to assigned verses in small groups
- Identifies one's conflict resolution style via the Kraybill Inventory and discuss its application in peacemaking

Notes:

Peacemaking

Wisdom: Seek wisdom that comes from God (Jas 3:17)

Love: Speaks truth in love to uplift (Eph 4:29)

High Expectations: “with God all things are possible” (Mark 10:27c)

Humility: Pursues reconciliation at the risk of their own comfort (Phil 2:3).

Repentance: Changes one’s way of thinking, seeks God’s purpose (Acts 17:30)

Scenario Analysis

Directions

- Working in pairs, identify conflict within the below provided scenario.
- What attributes of a peacemaker did Julia fail to demonstrate?
- How did it affect Marilyn?
- Consequently, what resulted in the interaction between the two women.

Unintentional Conflict

Julia works at clinic specializing in occupational, physical, or speech therapies for young adults with cerebral palsy. She just finished a certification for Marilyn, a young adult, age 18. Marilyn has some difficulty speaking and uses a wheelchair for mobility.

As they headed toward the door, Marilyn said something to Julia. Julia replied, “I’m sorry, I didn’t understand what you said.” So, Marilyn repeated her comment in a louder voice.

Looking a bit flustered, Julia said, “Okay, well, maybe we can talk about that the next time.”

Julia reaches for the door and says, “Let me get that for you.” Marilyn, at the same moment, angrily pushes the button for the automatic door and rolls away. Julia walks back to her office feeling embarrassed.
