Instructional Overview

Session 4: Topics

- Seven Feasts of Israel as listed in Lev 23
- Seven Feasts as a typology of New Testament future events

Lesson Big Ideas:

- In the Torah (Law), God gave Israel seven feasts throughout the year to observe and specifics of needs to be done. Each of these seven serves as a type for future events of the New Testament.
- Their typologies reveal the need to prepare for future prophetical events.

Essential Questions:

- Why are the seven feasts in Lev 23 important for Christians (who are non-Jewish) to know?
- How does knowledge of these feasts stress the importance of knowing the times in which we live?

Lesson Outcomes:

- Describes the seven feasts of Israel and explain the typology each one reveals (crucial to redemptive history of the Old Testament) through small group discussion, group discussion, and 350-500 word essay of a specific feast.
- Applies the information of the typology of the seven feasts with the importance of knowing the times in which we live in a 350-500 word essay.
