Instructional Overview

Session 5: Topics

- Davidic Covenant
- Prophecy of the First and Second Comings of Jesus

Lesson Big Ideas

- God made a covenant with David that his “throne shall be established forever.” It is through David’s genealogy that the Messiah (Jesus) was born.
- In the Old Testament, one finds many prophecies about the first and second comings of Jesus. The first coming prophecies have all come true, which makes us know we can trust those of the second.

Essential Questions

- What is the Davidic covenant and why is it important in redemptive history?
- Why it is important to identify Old Testament prophecy about the first and second comings of Jesus?

Lesson Outcomes

- Identify and explain some of the Old Testament prophecies of Jesus through small and whole group discussions.

- 2. Working in assigned groups, students will discuss the meaning of the verses.
- 3. Instructor will choose one person in each group to debrief.

Scripture Group Analysis

Scripture reveals many prophecies of the first coming of Jesus. The session will focus on a few of them.

Directions:

1. Class will break up in assigned groups.
2. Some groups will be assigned Ps 22: 1-8 and 14-18 while others will be given Isa 53.
3. Carefully read the assigned chapter.
4. Write the prophetic events from the assigned chapter and tell the fulfillment of the events. -- The prophetic events (mostly) were fulfilled on the day Jesus was crucified. Groups will use chart paper to write the prophetic events from their assigned chapter.
5. Groups will debrief.

3. Groups will discuss prophetic events from Zech 14:1-9 and connect them to New Testament prophetic events. No chart paper for this activity.
