Instructional Overview

Big Ideas:

- Your personal vision aligns to what God is doing in history according to His mission.
- All God was incarnate in Christ. The fullness of the Church is sent. Believers are God's called out people. The Lord calls us to be just, calls us to feed His sheep, calls us to mission.
- With the authority of the Name, comes the responsibility to use His name. If we accept the authority, we must accept the responsibility of the Name.

Essential Questions

• In what ways do the overcoming statements correlate and drive your personal visioneering statement as a servant leader in a multicultural church?

Learning Outcomes

• Students will exegete the rewards and applications to overcoming in Christ as pastoral leaders in visioneering, and then apply it to their personal ministry as servant pastors at Lighthouse Church of All Nations

Part I. Visioneering Plan for Pastoral Leadership (1400 - 1700 words)

A. Theology of Pastoral Leadership

Write about the right meaning, right attitudes/beliefs, and right practices of a pastor based on associated Scripture and readings from sessions one to four. (I want to see the scriptures you learned in class and readings put into action and quotes as appropriate in your paper.) Use second-level sub headers at the left margin (Right Meaning, Right Attitude/Beliefs, and Right Practices). It will make your paper easy to follow for you and me.

B. Self-Analysis of Pastoral Leadership Skills

- Self assessment of the extent to which you meet or don't meet the right meaning, right attitudes/beliefs and practices of a pastor based on what you wrote in Part 1. Add second-level headers at the left margin in this section, too (Right Meaning, Right Attitude/Beliefs, and Right Practices. Remember we all have room for continual growth!!! Address everything you wrote in the first part, which should align to the topics from sessions one to four.
- 2. Six-month action plan for self-improvement as you ready yourself for pastoral ordination. Add another second-level sub header here labeled, "Six-Month Action Plan."

Other Directions

- Consider this an integration paper, of which you will address everything you learned in class and then apply it to pastoral leadership. Think at the pastoral level, keeping the theme of servant in mind.
- Do integrate how you will lead pastorally in a multicultural church.
- Develop your paper evenly. You should write approximately 700 words for each part, one and two.
- You must type it. (I will not accept handwritten.) Do add introductory and closing paragraphs.
- Include two first-level sub headers (centered) labeled "Theology of Pastoral Leadership" and "Self-Analysis of Pastoral Leadership Skills."
- Provide introductory and closing paragraphs. Incorporate and thesis statement and key points, and then stick to it. You should present a cohesive and coherent paper.
- Double space your paper.
- Follow APA and SBL formatting.
- Write tight, with substance (See ANLI Writing guidelines for assistance.)

Part II. Prayer (150-200 words)

Write a personal prayer for overcoming that touches on each of the seven overcoming statements.

Part III. Leadership Application (300 to 500 words)

Pastor Phil, in *A Speck in Specs*, said, "I can imagine that it was a difficult task for the army of Israel to kill all the people in a city. Also, it is hard to kill the things that lead us to sin. It means giving up some things you love and ending or separating yourself from some relationships. It is about killing things that will separate you from Christ. It is hard to do, but it will be worth it" (2013, Section 4, para 3). How does his quote connect to the seven overcoming statements?

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
