Essay 1 (Zech 13:7/Mark 14:50; Matt 26:31)

The very night the disciples betrayed, denied, and abandoned Jesus, He declared the shepherd would be smitten and sheep scattered abroad (Matt 26:31). These words prophesied by Prophet Zechariah serve great significance today to all believers everywhere. Through His death, Jesus became the substitutionary atonement, (John 10:11) obliterating the effect of Sin, and by His Holy Spirit empowered disciples to spread the Gospel in the entire world after the scattering.

Jesus Christ took on the iniquity of the world, and He dealt with sin once and for all (Isa 53:6, Heb 9:28), and served as propitiator (1 John 2:2, Heb 9:5, Rom 3:25). Primarily, Jesus eliminated the separation of God and man and reconciled sinners to God (2 Cor 5:18-19, Col 1:21). Sin caused man's separation from God (Isa 59:2) and spiritual death (Rom 6:23). Then, He delivered sinners from spiritual death, the penalty of sin (Rom 6:23) by dying in sinners' place. Through the New Birth experience, there is remission of sin (John 3:6,7, Acts 2:38). Zechariah prophesied God would have a fountain opened to wash away sin and unrighteousness (Zech 13:1). Jesus, the living water, offers Himself to the world today! Moreso, He flows from the belly of believers as they worship, praise, prophecy, speak in tongues (John 7:37-39), and commune with Him. Jesus, the Good Shepherd laid down His life for His sheep (John 10:15), and today He offers any and all who believes in Him eternal life, and a fulfilling relationship.

Jesus secured the victory for believers and Israel, God's chosen people, and the Gospel is spreaded all over the world. The disciples and those that were filled with the Holy Spirit during the early days of the church became Jesus greatest witnesses. Originally, the Apostles were preaching in Judea and Jerusalem, and followers converted in the thousands. Then, believers were persecuted, and Jesus operated without limit in the lives of believers pilgrimage to various

locations outside Judea, and Jerusalem. Gentiles and messianic Jews performed His Word. Jesus fulfilled Zechariah's prophecy about His death, and believers await now for His' second coming. Believers are assured of Jesus' return and reign forever and ever.
