Key Scripture (John 9:22KJV)

“These *words* spake his parents, because they feared the Jews: for the Jews had agreed already, that if any man did confess that he was Christ, he should be put out of the synagogue.”

Instructional Overview

Big Ideas

- Each event brings prophetic witness of the coming Messiah to fruition through fulfillment.
- Every event in the life of Christ fulfills prophecy, verifying Jesus Christ, as God manifested in flesh through the fullness of the Godhead.
- The life of Christ not only chronicles the history of His earthly ministry, but also reveals His identity and purpose as the Messiah through His crucifixion on the cross, resurrection, and ascension.
- Jesus completes the human incarnation of all the fullness of the Godhead, Father, and Holy Ghost. Therefore, He is worthy to be called the one true God.
- From this union of God and man, one refers to Jesus as the Son of God. Scripture attributes all the names and titles of God to Jesus (John 1:1-14; Col 2:8-9).

Essential Questions

- What do the fulfilled Old Testament messianic prophecies in the events of Jesus earthly ministry reveal about His identity as Savior of the world, as God manifested in flesh through the fullness of the Godhead?

Learning Outcomes

- 2.3.1a Name Jesus' identity and purpose as the Messiah from each of the seven periods in Jesus' earthly ministry and defend its importance.

This week you will study the periods of popularity, opposition, and persecution.

How do think these three periods connect to the last two (preparation and prosperity)?

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
