Instructional Overview

Big Ideas

 In a culture wrought with widespread brokenness, many have become susceptible to the societal ills of man. Reconciliation and renewal in Christ heal the lost. To support healing, grace-filled leaders must reach and restore the community of believers through restorative ministry practices and reconciling competencies.


Essential Questions

- How do grace-filled leaders adapt restorative ministry practices to reconcile the lost to Christ?
- What does active listening mean?
- How do you define restorative ministry?

Learning Outcomes

- Analyzes and acts out scenarios based on restorative practices and active listening


