Big Ideas

Directions:

- Write tight—Concise, but with depth.
- Draw from the verses in activities two and three, as well as our class discussions.

- Make sure you include a thesis statement in your opening paragraph. The thesis includes the focus, precise opinion, and main points. Break out each of the key points into subsequent paragraphs.
- A thesis statement articulates the subject (or claim) of your essay; and concisely summarizes the position you will take.
- The body of your essay will support your thesis statement and persuade the reader that you have interpreted the information correctly and presented a valid position.
- Add a closing paragraph that sums up your thesis statement.

Application Essay Prompt

- Reflect on what we learned in class about the aspects of love and joy.
- Prompt: What do you take away from the narrative in John 21:15-19 about love in leadership?
